Effigy Mounds in the Preserve, April 19 (Saturday) 1:00 pm – 3:00 pm- Visit several effigy mound groups and discuss some environmental and cultural issues that may have influenced this ceremonial tradition of mound building that lasted from about 700 – 1100 A.D.
